R.R.220.3/B344s/1981. Bauer, Johannes Baptist. Encyclopedia of Biblical Theology. New York: Crossroad, 1981. A one volume edition of Sacramentum Verbi (1970). Contains signed articles (with bibliographies) by 53 European Catholic scholars on the theologically important words of the Bible gauged for a wide audience. Takes special note of the "essential lines of the development of concepts." Contains indexes of Scripture and Hebrew & Greek words.

R.R.230.03/C697. Stuhlmuehler, Carroll. The Collegeville Pastoral Dictionary of Biblical Theology. Collegeville, MN: Liturgical Press, 1996.

Signed articles by Catholic authors are intended to provide information for someone preparing a sermon or Bible lesson. Includes introductory articles "to introduce the reader to key background issues for situating the Bible in its own historical context and for proper interpretation of the Bible within the context of Church life;" major articles with "multiple, distinct components, usually contributed by three different scholars;" secondary articles focusing "on a particular topic, issue, or biblical motif, tracing its context and meaning in the Bible, and where appropriate, suggesting theological and pastoral implications;" and brief entries, which provide essential information on pertinent biblical subjects."

R.R.230.03/E92. Elwell, Walter A. Evangelical Dictionary of Biblical Theology. Grand Rapids: Baker Books, 1996.

Contains signed articles (with bibliographies attached to longer ones) by 128 Evangelical scholars on the biblical teaching on major theological ideas, on ideas that appear only a few times, and on the theology of individual books of the Bible. R.R.230.04103/N532. Alexander, T. Desmond, and Brian S. Rosner. New Dictionary of Biblical Theology. Downers Grove: InterVarsity Press, 2000.

Contains signed articles (with bibliographies) by 125 scholars. Part one contains 12 major articles, arranged thematically, on the fundamental issues of biblical theology; part two contains 7 articles on the theology of the most important biblical corpora, followed by articles (arranged canonically) on the individual books of the Bible. Part three contains articles on the major biblical themes. Provides numerous cross references and an index.

R.R.220.3/W532. Gowan, Donald E., ed. The Westminster Theological Wordbook of the Bible. Louisville: Westminster John Knox Press, 2003.

Contains signed articles (some with bibliography) by 31 contributors. Its goal is to "help in understanding all the English words of any theological significance" in the NRSV. Articles are written for those who do not know biblical languages and for those either without much theological training or for those who do not need the detailed treatment in more technical works.

R.R.220.3/R393t. Richardson, Alan. Theological Word Book of the Bible. New York: Macmillan, 1950.

Contains 230 short signed articles (some with bibliographies) by 31 (primarily British) scholars. Intends "to elucidate the distinctive meanings of the keywords of the Bible" with focus on the theological meanings. Contains numerous cross references.

R.R.220.3/A439c. Allmen, Jean Jacques von. Companion to the Bible. New York: Oxford University Press, 1958.

A translation of a 1954 French work. Contains longer signed articles on the major theological terms and ideas in the Bible. The 37 contributors are well-known French and Swiss Protestant scholars. Attempts to provide articles without technical jargon. Contains abundant cross references.

R.R.220.3/L582v/2. Leon-Dufour, Xavier. Dictionary of Biblical Theology. 2d ed. New York: Seabury Press, 1973.

A translation of a 1968 French Catholic work. Contains signed articles by 70 scholars on the major theological themes in the Bible. Intended for clergy and laity. Contains numerous cross references.

PER.205/B582a. Elenchus Bibliographicus Biblicus or Elenchus of Biblica.

Check in the Table of Contents (Index Generalis Elenchi Bibliographici Biblici) especially under the subjects "Hermeneutica biblica" and Theologia biblica."

R.R.016.221/M377. Martens, Elmer Arthur. Old Testament Theology. Grand Rapids: Baker Books, 1997. An annotated classified bibliography of 512 significant books, articles, and essays arranged under the following headings: reference works, serial literature, history of the discipline/state of the discipline, issues in the discipline, perspectives on O.T. theology, O.T. theologies, theologies of corpora, theologies book by book, and monographs on selected biblical themes. "Emphasis is on works written in English." Contains author index.

R.R.492.43/J54/1997. Jenni, Ernst, and Claus Westermann. Theological Lexicon of the Old Testament. 3v. Peabody, MA: Hendrickson Pub., 1997.

Contains signed articles on "the theologically relevant words of the O.T." A translation of Theologisches Handwörterbuch zum Alten Testament. At the beginning of each entry are references to other discussions of the word in the major lexicons and dictionaries. The articles are arranged under the following headings: root & derivation, statistical distribution of use in the O.T., meaning & history of meaning, theological usage, and postbiblical usage. Vol. 3 contains statistical tables and indexes of Hebrew & Aramaic words, English words, modern authors, and Scripture.

R.R.221.3/N532. VanGemeren, Willem. New International Dictionary of Old Testament Theology & Exegesis. 5v. Grand Rapids: Zondervan, 1997.

Contains signed articles by 206 scholars. Vol. 1 contains a "Guide to O.T. Theology and Exegesis" (pp. 3-218) with eleven chapters. The first ten summarize methodological concerns in interpreting the O.T. and chapter eleven suggests "ways of interacting with the Guide as well as the lexical/topical articles." The remainder of vol. 1, all of vols. 2-3, and about one-fourth of vol. 4 contain the lexical articles arranged in Hebrew alphabetical order. Hebrew words with related meanings are listed at the end of each article. Vol. 4 contains articles on topics, which includes discussions of proper names, the theology of each book of the O.T., historical epochs, peoples of the O.T., extrabiblical literature, and concepts. Vol. 5 contains indexes of Semantic fields, Hebrew words, Scriptures & subjects and conversion tables from Strong's numbers to Goodrick/Kohlenberger numbers and from Goodrick/ Kohlenberger numbers to Strong's numbers. R.R.492.43/B751t. Botterweck, G. Johannes. Theological Dictionary of the Old Testament. Grand Rapids: Eerdmans, 1974- .

Similar to TDNT "in its treatment of O.T. words, supplying not only the ancient Near Eastern background of the Hebrew and Aramaic words but also their theological meaning in the O.T." Vol. 14 (rasa-sakan) published in 2004.

R.R.492.43/T391. Harris, R. Laird, Gleason L. Archer, Jr., and Bruce K. Waltke. Theological Wordbook of the O.T. 2v. Chicago: Moody Press, 1980.

Articles by some 40 evangelical scholars on every Hebrew word of theological significance. Less exhaustive treatment for the "busy" minister and "earnest Christian worker."

R.R.225.3/N532. Brown, Colin. New International Dictionary of N.T. Theology. 3v. Grand Rapids: Zondervan, 1975-78.

Translation of a German work produced to aid theologians, pastors, and ministers of conservative Protestant backgrounds. Groups words expressing related ideas and concentrates on their theological meaning. English ed. contains many additions and revisions. Vol. 3 contains indexes of Greek, Hebrew, and English words. Addenda published in 1982. A separate Scripture index was published in 1985. Subsequent printings have been done in 4v with all indexes being included in vol. 4. Available on CD-ROM.

R.R.225.3/N734. Verbrugge, Verlyn. The NIV Theological Dictionary of New Testament Words. Grand Rapids: Zondervan, 2000.

An abridgement and rearrangement of the previous work. Articles are arranged in order by the Greek alphabet with cross references to other Greek words with similar English meanings. The following material has been deleted: all references to secondary literature, the extensive bibliographies, full-length articles on topics that fitted more in the category of systematic theology, articles that discussed the pros and cons of the interpretation of passages, and the history of word usage in classical Greek. The discussions of the same Greek word in multiple entries have been merged into one article. Articles have been included on words not included in the original set.

R.R.487.3/K62t. Kittel, Gerhard. Theological Dictionary of the N.T. 10v. Grand Rapids: Eerdmans, 1964-76.

R.R.487.3/K62t/Abr. Kittel, Gerhard, and Gerhard Friedrich. Theological Dictionary of the N.T. Abridged in one vol. Grand Rapids: Eerdmans, 1985.

All entries in the original set are included and presented in the same order and same basic format. "The focus is on the biblical and especially the N.T. usage, so that the related classical, Hellenistic, apocalyptic, rabbinic, and patristic fields receive mere cursory attention." Footnotes and bibliographies have been excluded.
