R.R.016/W759g/11th ed. Balay, Robert. Guide to Reference Books. 11th ed. Chicago: American Library Association, 1996.

A classified annotated list of about 15,500 reference works arranged under the following major headings: general reference, humanities, social & behavioral sciences, history & area studies, and science, technology & medicine. Contains author/title/subject index.

R.R.016/I38. American Doctoral Dissertations. Ann Arbor, MI: ProQuest Information and Learning Company.

An annual listing of dissertations for which doctoral degrees were granted in the U.S. and Canada, as well as those available on microfilm from ProQuest. Arranged by subject classification with author indexes. All Th.D. and Ph.D. dissertation abstracts in biblical studies which appeared in Dissertation Abstracts International (1979-June 1989) were published in the semi-annual issues of the journal Studia Biblica et Theologica v. 10-17 (1980-89). In July 1988 began to include British doctoral dissertations from approximately 50 universities in Dissertation Abstracts International and offer them for sale through ProQuest. These British dissertations are not included in American Doctoral Dissertations.

R.R.016/B582. Bibliographic Index. New York: H. W. Wilson Co., 1937-

A subject list of bibliographies containing 50 or more citations published separately or appearing as parts of books, pamphlets, and periodicals. Editors regularly examine about 2,800 periodicals for biblio-graphic material. Published in April and August with annual cumulation in December.

R.R.423/M982o/1989. Oxford English Dictionary. 2nd ed. 20 v. Oxford: Clarendon Press, 1989.

Traces the history of each word as actually used during the last 800 years.

R.R.808.8/S847h. Stevenson, Burton Egbert. Home Book of Quotations. 9th ed. New York: Dodd, Mead, 1964.

A collection of more than 50,000 quotations arranged alphabetically by subject. Includes an index of authors and a word index which indexes the quotations by leading words.

R.R.808.8/O98. Knowles, Elizabeth, ed. The Oxford Dictionary of Quotations. 6th ed. New York: Oxford University Press, 2004.

Arranged alphabetically by author with a keyword index.

R.R.808.81/G758/1997. Frankovich, Nicholas. Columbia Granger's Index to Poetry in Anthologies. 11th ed. New York: Columbia University Press, 1997.

Indexes over 75,000 poems from 379 anthologies. Title, first line and last line index indicates anthology which contains poem. Contains author and subject indexes with lists of poem titles. New editions are published every few years. Each new edition adds and deletes anthologies.

R.R.317.3/W927. World Almanac, 2007.

R.R.423.1/R685. Rodale, Jerome Irving. Synonym Finder. Emmaus, PA: Rodale Press, 1978.

Contains more than 1,500,000 words but makes no attempt to differentiate or discuss nuances of meaning for the synonyms.

R.R.424/W395d/1978. Webster's New Dictionary of Synonyms. Springfield, MA: G & C Merriam Co., 1978.

More than a word list. Contains discriminatory articles "to distinguish the differences in implications, connotations and applications" of the words listed.

R.R.808.88/D554/1983. Guinagh, Kevin. Dictionary of Foreign Phrases and Abbreviations. New York: H. W. Wilson Co., 1983.

Lists foreign phrases, proverbs, abbreviations, etc., frequently used in written and spoken English.

R.R.423.1/S399. Schwartz, Robert J. Complete Dictionary of Abbreviations. New York: Crowell, 1959.

Lists abbreviations of societies, institutions, government agencies, degrees, as well as scientific and technical abbreviations.

R.R.050/W187. Wall, C. Edward. Periodical Title Abbreviations. Detroit: Gale Research Co., 1969.

R.R.910.3/C726/1998. Cohen, Saul B. Columbia Gazetteer of the World. 3v. New York: Columbia University Press, 1998.

Contains 165,000 entries on the places of the political world (countries, provinces, regions, states, counties, capitals, cities, towns, villages, neighborhoods, federal & other districts), physical world (continents, oceans, seas, lakes, lagoons, rivers, bays, inlets, channels, streams, islands, archipelagos, peninsulas, atolls, mountains, mountain ranges, canyons, deserts, valleys & volcanoes), and all special places (national parks & monuments, historic & archaeological sites, airports, harbors, dams, nuclear plants, mines, canals, shopping malls, theme parks, stadia, military bases, and other destinations of interest). Gives pronunciation, population, geographical & political location, and other pertinent facts.

R.R.028.12/K61/1994. Kister, Kenneth F. Kister's Best Encyclopedias: A Comparative Guide to General and Specialized Encyclopedias. 2nd ed. Phoenix: Oryx Press, 1994.

Reviews 77 general English language encyclopedias, 19 electronic general encyclopedias and contains an annotated list of over 800 English language specialized encyclopedias and 43 foreign language

general encyclopedias. Also offers suggestions on how to choose encyclopedias and lists sources which contain evaluations of encyclopedias.

R.R.031/F527. Ryan, Joe. First Stop: The Master Index to Subject Encyclopedias. Phoenix, AZ: Oryx Press, 1989.

Subject index to 430 English-language subject encyclopedias, dictionaries, handbooks, comprehensive textbooks, and other standard reference sources. Criteria for selection of sources to be indexed: current & readily available, authoritative & of some length (250 words or more per entry), and each article must include a bibliography.

R.R.031/M676. Mirwis, Allan N. Subject Encyclopedias: User Guide, Review Citations, and Keyword Index. 2v. Phoenix, AZ: Oryx Press, 1999.

Vol. 1 lists by Library of Congress classification number 1,129 English language encyclopedias published (either as a revision or as new) between 1990 and 1997. Each is given a review scale (from 1 to 5) based on recommendations in reviews of 9 library publications that regularly review reference books and an overall rating (from 1 to 10). Vol. 2 is a keyword index to the entries in 98 of these encyclopedias.

General Reference Internet Resources

YourDictionary.com (<http://www.yourdictionary.com>)

Provides links to over 2,500 dictionaries and to grammars in over 300 languages. Includes multilingual and specialized dictionaries.

InfoPlease (<http://www.infoplease.com>)

Material is categorized under the following headings: daily almanac, world, United States, history & government, biography, sports, arts & entertainment, business, society & culture, and health & science. Also contains the Columbia Encyclopedia (6th ed., 2001), the Infoplease Dictionary, Infoplease Atlas, and several useful features, e.g., chronologies, statistics, calendars, and country

profiles.

Bartleby (<http://bartleby.com>)

Contains several quotation sources, including Bartlett's Familiar Quotations (1919), handbooks, anthologies, and collected works of famous authors. Also contains the Harvard Classics, the Columbia Encyclopedia (6th, 2001), The World Factbook (2001), and Columbia Gazetteer of North America (2000) among its more than 200 full-text works.

CIA World Factbook (<https://www.cia.gov/library/publications/the-world-factbook/index.html>)

Contains country guides with data arranged under the following categories: geography, communications, people, transportation, government, military, economy, and transnational issues. Revised annually.
